












THE MASCO LEGACY

2023 OVERVIEW

In 2023, a year when nonprofits had deeper needs from inflationary pressures, we stayed committed to a majority of the organizations and causes we have supported in recent years to provide our partners with a sustainable funding resource. As we aim to play a greater part in solving the biggest issues facing our communities, we increasingly engaged with our partners to track progress, address challenges and co-create solutions.

Several of our strategic partners have embarked on capital campaigns over the last year, looking to address limitations in their service capacity that COVID-19 brought to light. In turn, Masco and our business units have stepped up during this period of critical investment and rebuilding, ensuring higher levels of support to these partners as they work harder than ever to expand domestic violence shelters to new, underserved geographies; double capacity for addiction treatment services; or overhaul their program models to re-center equity— all without slowing down current operations.

2023 particularly saw the growing impact of our non-cash donations. After the supply chain fluctuations of the past few years, our businesses' ability to donate in-kind product has steadily rebounded, increasing significantly from our 2022 in-kind donations. Additionally, our employees continued to be guided by our values and our purpose to deliver better living possibilities for all, making a difference in their communities by going beyond financial contributions to giving of their time and talent. Our corporate Legal Department, for instance, continued their commitment to using their skills to promote equity, volunteering as a team at expungement and drivers' license restoration clinics. And Behr Paint Company celebrated the 20th year of their Behr Cares employee volunteering program, which experienced a 5% increase in participation year over year.

In both big ways and small, in 2023 Masco leveraged our resources to create positive impact in the communities where our employees live, work and do business.






MASCO HELPS WELCOME NEW REFUGEE NEIGHBORS TO SOUTHEAST MICHIGAN

In 2023, Masco partnered with the nonprofit Samaritas and St. John's Episcopal Church in Plymouth, Michigan, to turn a vacant colonial house on St. John's property into a transitional home for resettling refugee families coming to the Great Lakes State. With capacity to fit up to eight people, the home will serve one family at a time; when the residing family is on their feet and ready to move into their own place, another refugee family in need will take over occupancy of the house. Families in the home will also continue to receive support services from Samaritas, the Michigan affiliate of Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service, which has resettled thousands of people from dozens of countries.

Needing funding for remodeling and furnishings, St. John's found local organizations large and small to donate cash, provide product, and volunteer time. In addition to financial support, Masco was proud to donate a range of our products, from Delta® showerheads, faucets, and toilets to Kichler® lighting and BEHR® paint.

The home's first residents moved in in late October. Masco HQ is excited to welcome them to our community and looks forward to the impact this home will have for years to come!



DELTA FAUCET COMPANY SUPPORTS FIREFLY CHILDREN & FAMILY ALLIANCE

For the third year in a row, the Working Parents Community (WPC) at Delta Faucet Company (DFC) partnered with Firefly Children & Family Alliance to raise funds for their Children's Shelter and Courage Center. With the monetary donations, WPC members purchased and delivered over 100 items to Firefly in September, including backpacks, hair care products and other essentials – just in time for the new school year.

Located near DFC headquarters in Indianapolis, Firefly's programs include adoption support, services for those aging out of foster care, and a short-term shelter for runaway or at-risk kids. In addition to crisis workers and case managers, the Children's Shelter provides transportation for youth to attend their home school where possible; on-site education; and enrichment activities like yoga, art programs and field trips.

"Seeing how DFC colleagues rally to support our community is always powerful," says WPC member Kara Sheads. "It's gratifying to know that our donations will add to Firefly services that benefit the youth in our community."



MASCO HELPS COALITION "SHINE LIGHT" ON MENTAL HEALTH

Masco is proud to be collaborating with the American School Health Association, Elevance Health, nonprofit Erika's Lighthouse, and the National PTA on Shine Light on Depression, a free online toolkit with effective, ready-to-use mental health, depression awareness, and suicide prevention programs for students in grades 4-12.

Designed with school communities and community-based organizations in mind, Shine Light on Depression seeks to create hopeful conversations in an honest, fact-based, and culturally inclusive manner, and can be adapted to diverse populations. Shine Light on Depression also focuses special attention on Title 1 schools and organizations in several high-need geographies, ensuring underserved communities can use the curriculum to educate about and address mental health issues.

During the 2022-2023 school year, the program reached more than half a million students across over 2,000 schools in 49 states. 63% of the participating schools are Title 1 schools.

"Masco is proud to support mental health and wellness initiatives not just among our employees, but also in our communities," says Jennifer LaFlair, Director of Benefits at Masco. "Shine Light on Depression helps break down stigmas around mental health and suicide prevention for our kids and teens, making them more likely to seek help when they need it and equipping them to recognize the signs when friends or family members are struggling with depression."

BEHR PARTICIPATES IN HOMEAID ORANGE COUNTY'S DIAPER DRIVE

In June, Behr Paint Company served as the presenting sponsor of the HomeAid Orange County Diaper Drive Drop-Off event. Located in the Angel Stadium Parking Lot, this event was the culmination of a monthlong campaign that collected 1.1 million essential items, such as diapers, baby wipes, and food. The donations will support approximately 1,000 babies and toddlers of families experiencing poverty and homelessness who are served through the Orange County Diaper Bank, as well as those residing at the 70 shelters and affordable housing projects developed by HomeAid Orange County. A group of Behr team members used Behr Cares volunteer time-off hours to help facilitate the drop-off, and even more colleagues at Behr headquarters in Santa Ana collected funds for the purchase of diapers and related essentials.

The 2023 Diaper Drive also saw HomeAid Orange County's law enforcement and homebuilding industry partners compete in the annual Diaper Structure competition, presenting creatively crafted sets constructed of diaper boxes to raise awareness about poverty and homelessness throughout Orange County. Behr executive Richard Maus, Senior Vice President of People Services, shared his thoughts about the diaper drive, saying, "We are honored to have played a role in the success of this important initiative and proud to see our Behr team members involved at every level, from donating money towards essential items, volunteering at the drop off day, to judging the diaper structure contest and presenting the Best in Show award. The participating organizations demonstrated creativity, commitment, and a passion to raise awareness of families in need with babies and toddlers.

"We appreciate HomeAid Orange County's ongoing commitment to help make a difference in the lives of those affected by homelessness."


MATCHING GIFT PROGRAM

A key component of our Community Development strategy is to support the organizations our employees are passionate about and empower our people to maximize their own impact. 

EDUCATION

The Education component of Masco Million Differences supports academic opportunities for underrepresented populations to increase their access to the workplace pipeline, including scholarship organizations, mentorship programs, college preparedness initiatives and classroom-based learning.

FUTURE ENGINEERS TOUR MERCURY PLASTICS

In 2023, Mercury Plastics continued to support University of Akron programs aimed at increasing minority enrollment in the engineering school. As a regular sponsor of the Women in Engineering Program; the Increasing Diversity in Engineering Academics (IDEAs) program; and specific campus events like the Black, Brown and Beyond Male Summit, Mercury Plastics is proud to help the University of Akron make careers in engineering accessible and welcoming to students of all backgrounds.

In June, the university's Women in Engineering Program hosted a weeklong Summer Experience in Engineering Camp for 23 students entering grades 9-12. From tours to local engineering firms to hands-on projects, along with social activities, the camp offered valuable experiences for high school students interested in learning more about aerospace systems, biomedical, chemical, civil, computer, corrosion, electrical and mechanical engineering. To further enhance their understanding of the engineering industry, the camp included visits to five local companies, where participants met engineers and gained valuable insights into the real-world applications of engineering. Mercury Plastics was pleased to be one of the host companies for these student tours and interact with the campers.

Speaking about the participating companies, Dr. Craig Menzemer, dean of the College of Engineering and Polymer Science, said, "Our industry and company partnerships have been invaluable in providing real-world exposure and opportunities for the students. The collaboration with these organizations has not only enriched their learning experiences but also opened doors to exciting career prospects. As we look ahead, we are excited about the potential to welcome the campers to our University and College one day."



JOB TRAINING AND EMPLOYMENT INITIATIVES

WATKINS WELLNESS PARTICIPATES IN GIRLS RISING CAREER FAIR

In May, members of the Watkins Wellness team participated in the Career and STEM Fair of their nonprofit partner Girls Rising, a San Diego-based nonprofit that empowers young women through mentorship and career readiness support. At the event, Watkins employees spoke with the young women about their interests and careers, and answered questions about their own career paths.

Participating Watkins team member Nadia Guerrero, Talent Acquisition Business Partner, said, "It's an honor to support an organization that empowers young ladies by providing them with the knowledge and tools they need to navigate their environment and future possibilities."

Watkins' support funds Girls Rising's transitional program, Women Emerging, which in 2023 served ten young women in San Diego between the ages of 18 and 24 through personal and professional development. Women Emerging seeks to helps young women who have experienced significant challenges in childhood grow into adulthood and gain career readiness within a supportive network that allows them to discover their full potential

BEHR TEAM MEMBERS GROW ROOTS WITH OCAPICA

In 2023, Behr Paint Company was proud to continue its support for the Orange County Asian Pacific Islander Community Alliance (OCAPICA), which works to build a healthier and stronger community by enhancing the well-being of Asians and Pacific Islanders through inclusive partnerships in the areas of service, education, advocacy, organizing, and research. In addition to Behr's financial support for the nonprofit during 2023, several Behr team members gave their time through participation in various OCAPICA events.

In April, a group of Behr volunteers spent time mulching, harvesting and planting seeds at the Magnolia Agriscience Community Center, an urban agricultural farm built on the Magnolia High School campus in Anaheim. With support from OCAPICA, the garden strives to educate students, families, and the community about sustainable agricultural practices, nourishment, and community building, and is located in a part of Anaheim that's known as a "food desert", with a lack of stores selling healthy foods.



I also love that this was at a continuation school where many students are currently looking for a job. It brings me joy that I was able to help prepare them for their success."
